## Text Fields on the Transaction Menu

There are six text fields available for you to use:

- Card Number: The last 7 digits of a fuel card or virtual driver number
- Site Number: Also known as the CFN ID. This is the number that the fuel stations have that are provided by CFN.
- Account Number: The number that is associated with your account. This is a pre-filled, required field.
- **Date:** The year, month, and day that denotes the start of the date range, in a YYYYMMDD format. This is a required field.

**IMPORTANT NOTE:** If you do not enter a date in the End Date text field, it will show all transactions for the day found in the Date text field.

- End Date: The year, month, and day that denotes the end of the date range, in a YYYYMMDD format. This is an optional field.
- **Time:** The hours, minutes, and seconds that happened with respect to the station's local time zone. This is optional.

## Transaction Menu: Explanation of Headers

**Introduction:** The system captures 16 points of data whenever you and/or your driver(s) pump fuel at the station. In this video, we will take the time to share what each of the 16 data points mean.

On your screen is an example of the 16 headers that you see whenever you go into the Transaction Menu.

- Site: The number that is assigned to the fuel station by the system
- Tran: The transaction number that is assigned by the fuel station
- Card: The last 7 digits of the plastic or virtual driver number
- Jbr: The number that is associated with your fuel card issuer
- Acct: The number that is associated with the account that the card or driver is under
- **Qty**: The number of gallons of fuel product that was purchased
- Date: The local day, month, and year of the fuel station that a transaction took place
- **Time**: The local time of the fuel station that a transaction took place
- Auth: A 6-digit number that is generated by the fuel station assigned to a unique transaction
- **Pump**: The pump number that is assigned by the fuel station
- **Product**: The code that is assigned to the fuel product
- **Card Input**: A code that shares what type of interaction the card had with the pump. "2" is the most common code that means that the card was physically swiped at the pump.
- Vehicle: The number that is associated with the vehicle at the time of transaction
- **Odometer**: The odometer reading that the user entered at the time of transaction
- Misc Entry: A deprecated function.
- **Received**: The year, month, day, hour, minute, and second that the transaction ended.
